The Hotel: The hotel is located on the San Francisco Bay, one mile south of the San Francisco International Airport, 20 minutes from downtown San Francisco, and 20 minutes from the Silicon Valley. San Francisco's famous BART rapid-transit line serves the airport and provides a quick trip into the heart of San Francisco. A seven-mile-long walking path, perfect for strollers, passes in front of the hotel and along the Bay. All guestrooms have high speed internet access. The hotel has an indoor swimming pool and fitness center.

Complimentary Hotel Shuttle: Available 24 hours a day to and from San Francisco International Airport.

Millbrae will end at Old Bayshore Highway. Turn right. The hotel is on the left 1/4 mile south on Old Bayshore Highway. Turn left at Mitten Avenue into the hotel driveway.
