## CALL FOR PRESENTERS

The theme of the 2006 NAAPAE Annual Conference is: “**Hear Our Voices: Here We Are!**”

The conference format has three strands: **Asian/Pacific Islander Leadership; Outreach to Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) Communities**, and **AAPI Research**. We are calling for individuals to present workshops on leadership development and outreach to AAPI communities. We are also calling individuals to present summaries of research papers on AAPIs. Workshops are scheduled for Saturday, April 29, and 90 minutes.

Saturday sessions for research papers will provide researchers 10 to 15 minutes to present a summary of their research and implications for AAPIs.

**The Hotel:** Within walking distance—approximately two-and-a-half blocks—of the National Education Association building, 1201 16<sup>th</sup> St. NW.

#### **Transportation to the Holiday Inn Central**

**From Reagan National Airport:** Cab fare from the airport is approximately \$18. The hotel is accessible via the Metro Blue Line from Reagan National Airport. Exit at the McPherson Square Station and walk approximately 5½ blocks on 15<sup>th</sup> St. to the hotel. Or take a cab from the station.

**From Dulles Airport:** Cab or limo service from Dulles airport ranges from \$65 to \$80. Shuttle service from Dulles Airport is \$26 with SuperShuttle (go to <[www.SuperShuttle.com](http://www.SuperShuttle.com)> to make reservations). The Metro is also available by taking the Metro bus (approximately \$8) to the West Falls Church Metro Station. Transfer to the Metro Orange Line, exit at the McPherson Square Station, and walk approximately 5½ blocks on 15<sup>th</sup> St. to the hotel. Or take a cab from the station.

**From the Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport (BWI):** Use one of the shuttle services—a cab can cost \$75 or more. AMTRAK and MARC trains run from BWI to Union Station in DC. Then take a cab to the hotel. (Go to the AMTRAK website for AMTRAK schedules or to <[www.MTAMaryland.com](http://www.MTAMaryland.com)> for MARC train schedules.)

**Hotel Parking:** \$25 overnight (for hotel guests only)
