The Hotel: The hotel is located on the San Francisco Bay, one mile south of the San Francisco International Airport, 20 minutes from downtown San Francisco, and 20 minutes from the Silicon Valley. San Francisco's famous BART rapid-transit line serves the airport and provides a quick trip into the heart of San Francisco. A seven-mile-long walking path, perfect for strollers, passes in front of the hotel and along the Bay. All guestrooms have high speed internet access. The hotel has an indoor swimming pool and fitness center.
